The pay item for removal of guardrail shall include the bridge end sections, posts, terminal end sections, cable anchors, etc.

Earthwork

Where applicable, the existing shoulders and/or bridge approach embankments are to be widened to conform to the requirements of the Standard Drawings unless otherwise directed. This work will be accomplished by building up the slopes with borrow material. The slopes will be modified on the taper area adjacent to the terminal end section and blended into the existing slope as required.

Erosion Control

Erosion control practices (silt fence and wattles.) shall be utilized to prevent the loss of loose material at all areas that are disturbed. Solid Sod will be required on all disturbed areas. 


