





Shady and restful are Mississippi highways.


A typical ante-bellum home.




IT'S A FACT—

That the first concrete highway completed south of the Ohio River was in Lee County, Mississippi.
That the longest perfectly straight and level concrete highway in the United States is a 32-mile link on U. S. 61, north of Clarksdale, Mississippi.
Mississippi is eighth in list of states in all-ways on the state system.
Mississippi's four year program, begun in 1939, has cost \$85,000,000 for paved state highways.
There is no gasoline tax diversion in Mississippi.
