Hurricane Evacuation Tips

When hurricanes are approaching, don't take chances. Know before you go and stay informed.

- Know where you'll go, whether it's a family member's house, hotel or shelter.
- Know your primary evacuation route and have a secondary route planned as a backup. [See evacuation map on reverse side.]
- To avoid congestion on Hwy 49, consider taking an alternate evacuation route.
- Make arrangements for your pets. [Pets are NOT allowed in most shelters.]
- Seek information from local officials regarding road closures and additional emergency information.
- Fill up your gas tank and have cash on hand.
- Download the MDOT Traffic App to get real time, location-based notifications about road conditions, weather and more.
- Take your time and be patient!

Hurricane Evacuation Routes

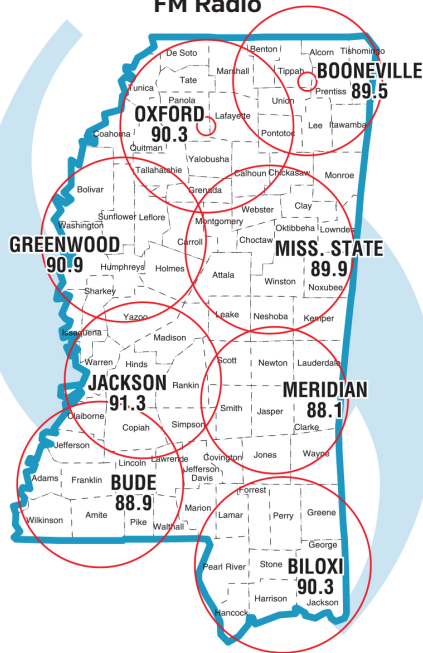
See the reverse side for a map of official hurricane evacuation routes highlighted in blue and green. Use it to plan your path to safety.

Contraflow Plans

I-59 and I-55 Contraflow Plans

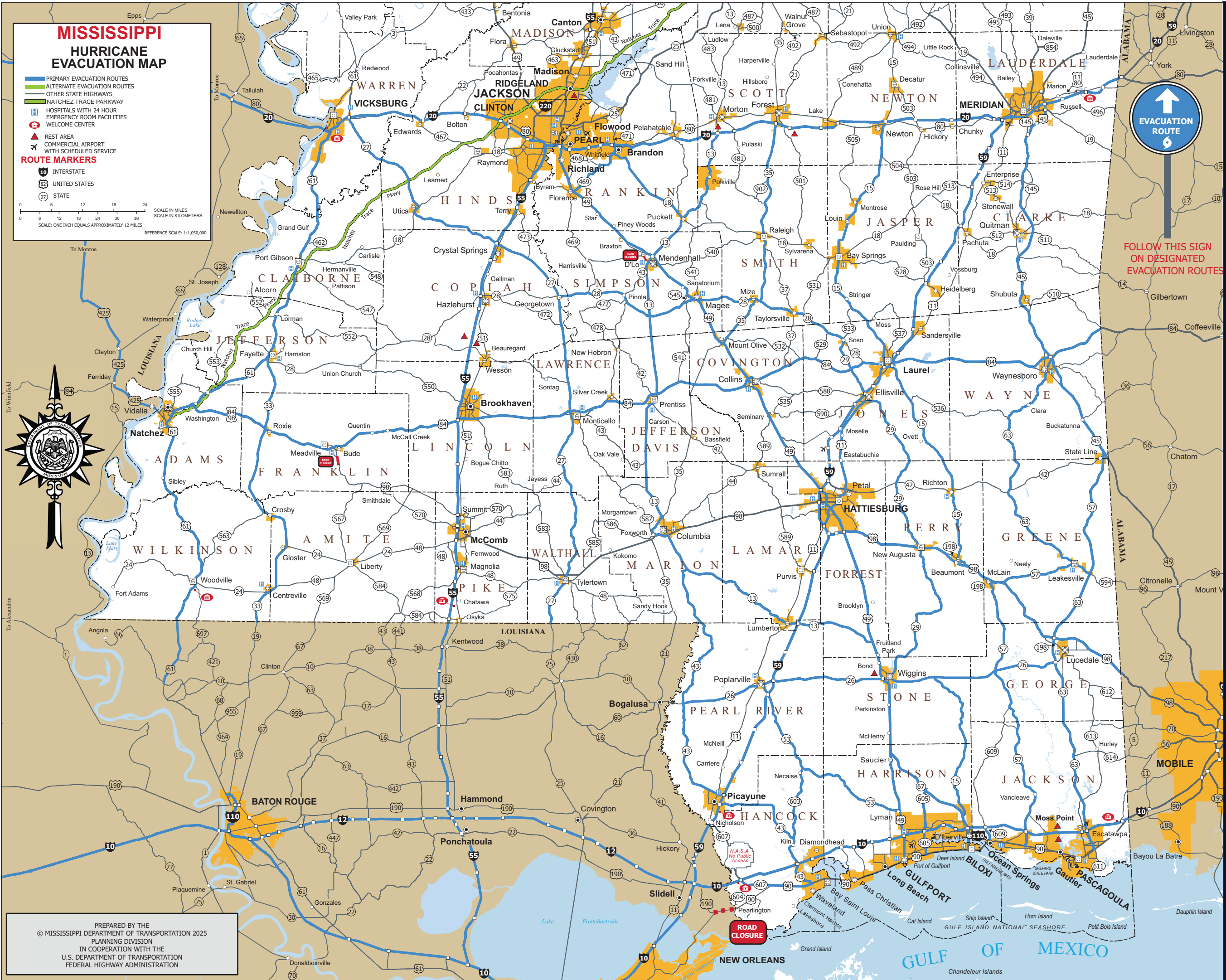
To assist the state of Louisiana, MDOT will implement contraflow (all lanes flow northbound) for both I-59 and I-55 when requested by the Governor of Louisiana and approved by the Governor of Mississippi. Category III, IV or V hurricanes in the Gulf of Mexico might prompt a mandatory evacuation of the greater New Orleans area.

- The decision to contraflow is NOT automatic and will only be used when absolutely necessary. Citizens **should not delay** evacuation in anticipation of contraflow.
- The I-59 contraflow operations will begin in Louisiana, extend into Mississippi, and end just south of Hattiesburg.
- The I-55 contraflow operations will begin in Louisiana, extend into Mississippi, and end just south of Brookhaven.
- All exits within the contraflowed sections of the interstate highways **will remain open** as traffic conditions allow. Law enforcement officers will be present to assist with traffic control.
- The shoulders of both I-59 and I-55 should be kept clear for emergency vehicles. Motorists who need to stop should use the next available exit.
- Hancock County residents traveling westbound to Louisiana on I-10 will be routed North onto I-59 at the I-10/I-12 split.
- Contraflow operations *cannot* be considered on Highway 49.



Hattiesburg Traffic Control

During hurricane evacuations, traffic congestion in the Hattiesburg area can be severe. To reduce area congestion and optimize the flow of traffic, MDOT may restrict or close entrances and exits on U.S. 49 N, I-59 and U.S. 98 W as traffic conditions warrant. These closures may occur with or without contraflow in place.



MDOT has free resources to assist you in the event of an evacuation. Access what you need to know about road conditions, weather and more – even locate welcome centers and rest areas.
