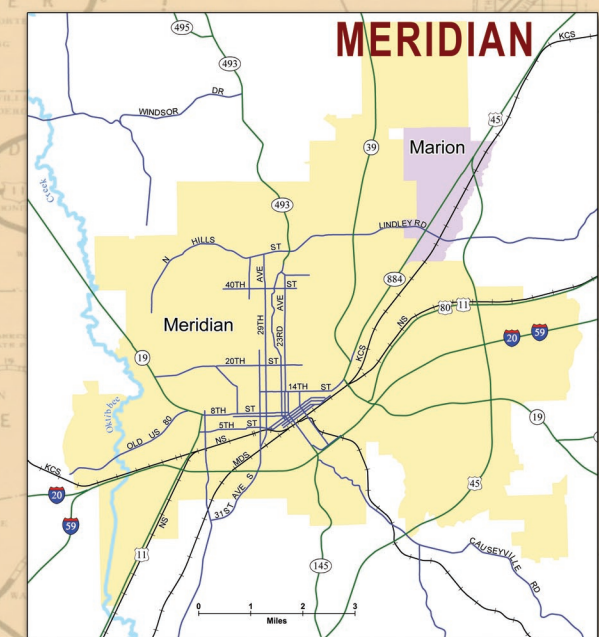
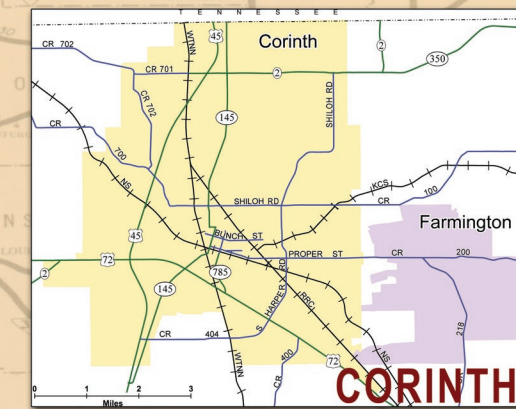
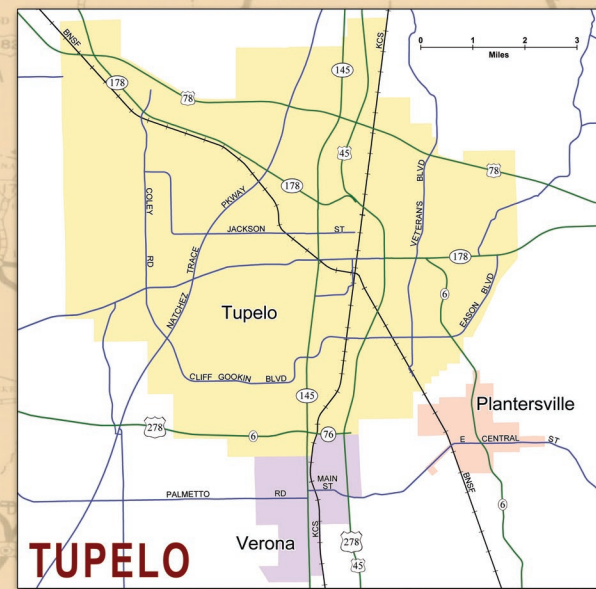
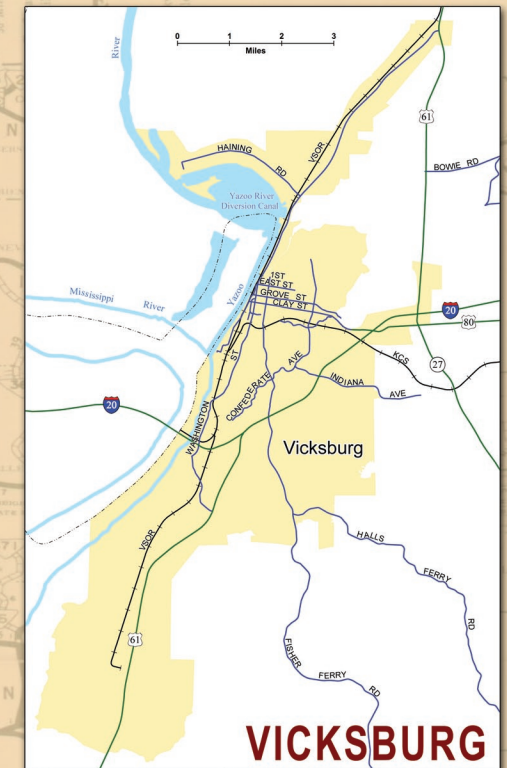
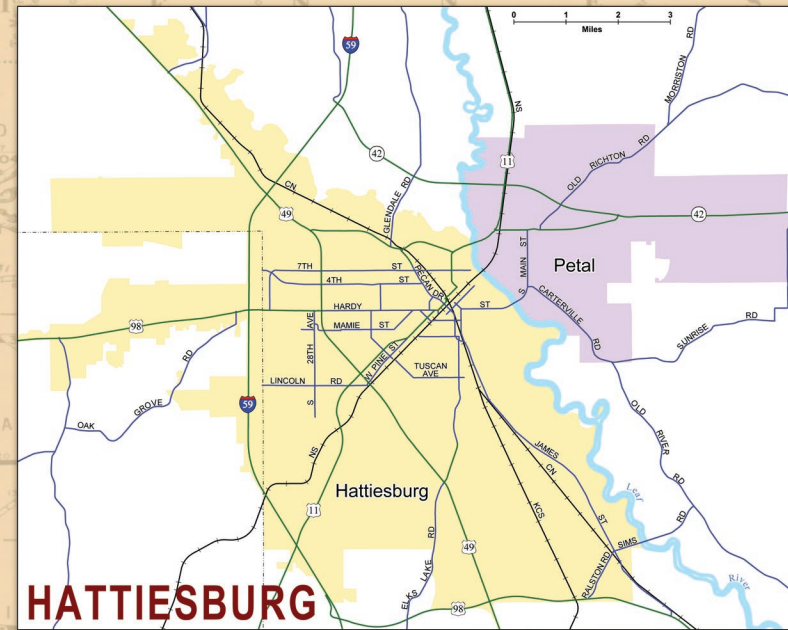
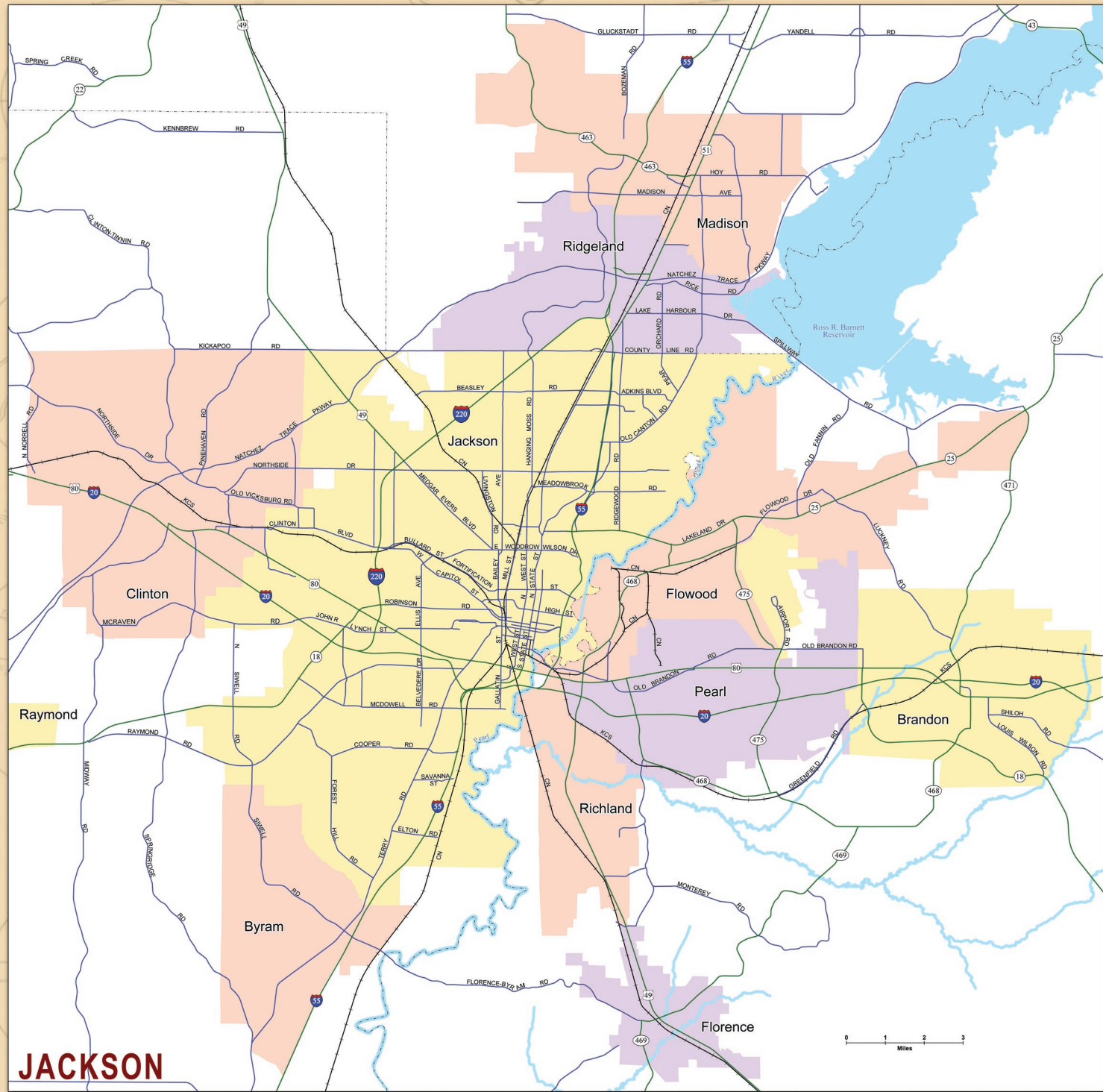


LOCAL AREA MAPS

SAFETY TIPS

- Always expect a train at a highway-rail grade crossing. "Any time is train time."
- Never stop, shift your vehicle on the tracks or pass another vehicle at a highway-rail grade crossing. Never drive across a railroad crossing until you are sure you can clear the tracks on the other side without stopping. "If you don't fit don't commit."
- After the first train clears a multi-track highway-rail grade crossing always look and listen for a second train coming from either direction. Be sure ALL tracks are clear before you proceed.
- Trucks carrying hazardous materials and school buses must always stop before crossing the tracks. Make sure to give them enough room to do their job at all railroad crossings.
- Railroad property is private property. Never use the tracks to hunt or fish, or for recreational purposes. Always Stay Off, Stay Away, and Stay Alive.

- If your vehicle stalls on the tracks, get everyone out immediately and away from the tracks. Then call 911 to report the emergency situation.
- If the gates are down, the road is closed. Never go around lowered gates. It is illegal and the gates are there for your safety.
- A crossbuck sign means yield. Always be prepared to yield to a train.
- Never race a train to a highway-rail grade crossing. If it is a tie you lose!
- Remember to Look, Listen, and Live at railroad crossings.
